Interim WMH Board Update

The first meeting of the Interim WMH Board was held in January 2019 attended by Glenn Paton, Sue Briggs, Wim van Noortwijk and Adrian Stephenson.

Existing Interim Board members were allocated portfolios. Glenn and Wim will be Co-Chairs to provide direction to the meetings. Glenn will manage the portfolio of "Commercial" and Wim will be responsible for working with National Associations and local Masters Groups to establish a harmonious membership arrangement(s). Adrian Stephenson will be the contact person for the 2020 World Cup in Japan. Sue Briggs was allocated the secretarial duties.

Key functional areas were also identified that required additional resources on the Board in the areas of finance, events and IT.

The Interim WMH Board is pleased to announce the addition of Sean Curran (Events), Steve Winnall (IT) and David Ferguson (Treasurer) to the Board. Ishbel Dickens has been invited to provide additional secretarial resources by taking on the position of Assistant Secretary.

The key tasks for the Interim Board include:

- Setting a date for the first General Assembly and commencing planning for this event including nominations and elections of office bearers.
- Fine tuning of Memorandum & Articles of Association (Constitution)
- Finalising the MOU with FIH
- Ensuring all tournament documentation be standardised by the start of 2020, especially the World Cups.
- Confirm venues for all World Cups in 2020.
- Planning the shape of the WMH Board post General Assembly.
- Plan WMH budget income and expenditure.

First General Assembly

The Interim WMH Board is pleased to announce that the first General Assembly will be held on Friday 2 August 2019. Venue to be confirmed.

Membership/NAs and Local Masters Organisations working together

The Interim WMH Board is very keen to make contact with all National Associations, member Master organisations and contacts to encourage a collaborative approach to determining representation in WMH. These groups will need to apply for membership of WMH and appoint a delegation to represent them at the General Assembly. A country will be eligible for one vote only but delegations of up to three will be welcome to attend the General Assembly.

Bids process for 2020 World Cup underway

In 2020 the World Cup will be split into four separate Tournaments. At this stage bids are being sought for the following three Tournaments:

- Mixed Gender for age groups Over 35 & Over 40
- Mixed Gender for age groups Over 45 & Over 50
- Mixed Gender for age groups Over 55 & Women's 60 & 65 and the 'Spirit of Masters'.

The World Cup for Men's Over 60s, 65s, 70 and 75s has been confirmed to be hosted by Japan in most likely late September 2020 at the Olympic venue.

The Events Director (Sean Curran) is overseeing the bid process utilising a suite of documentation developed over the last 12 months.

Bids are to be submitted by February 15 with an expected announcement of hosts by mid March. Announcements will be made as soon as possible.
