Memo: Yellow Cards in game Canada vs Uruguay 9 April 2014

The Team Manager MENDONCA Cassius was notified after the game that the player #4 WATSON Kaelan along with the Team Manager and another team representative if desired would need to attend a hearing with the TD Zelkin Rene'on 10 April 2014 related to the two yellow cards received in the game Canada vs Uruguay at 11:30am at the Hotel Regency to review the cards with the player. This is a potential Level 1 offense and the player was able to bring any documentation or video she felt necessary to the meeting. The Team manager was referred to the FIH Code of Conduct Appendix 10 in the Tournament Regulations Indoor Competitions – February 2014.

In the game on 9 April 2014, the Canada Player #4 WATSON Kaelan received two yellow cards: At the 22nd minute for a breakdown push which was for a 2 minute duration At the 40th minute for breakdown tackle which was for a 2 minute duration It was observed by the TO and TD on her way to the bench, the player used abusive language and slammed her stick on the floor.

According to the FIH Code of Conduct in the FIH Tournament Regulations Indoor Competitions – February 2014, this is a Level 1 violation namely:

- Inappropriate and deliberate physical contact between players in the course of play
- Using rude or abusive language, gestures or hand signals gestures which are considered to be obscene, offensive or insulting
- Abuse of hockey equipment or clothing, venue equipment or fixtures and fittings

The meeting took place at 1130 am with the Team Manager MENDONCA, Assistant Coach JOHL Carla and player #4 Watson. The yellow cards, signed code of conduct and players response to the cards were reviewed. She was contrite during the meeting, she stated it was the last minute of the game, she did admit that her tackles were wrong and her behavior was not a good refection on her team or her country. The player does not have a history of disciplinary matters.

Due to the facts as stated above, the Canada Player #4 WATSON receives an official reprimand for the behavior. If the player #4 Watson receives another yellow card, she will be suspended for one game.
